1.

My name is Stephen G. Weizenecker, I am over eighteen years of age, I am competent to testify, and the facts stated herein are within my personal knowledge.

2.

This is my recollection of what occurred in 2002 in relation to Mr. Mark Kadish.

3.

This letter contains statements that may be construed as attorney client privileged.

4.

I remember many discussions with Mr. Hintz regarding his representation by Mr. Kadish. Scott explained his concern about the quality of representation. Scott had paid Mr. Kadish a substantial sum as a retainer. Further, Mr. Hintz had placed substantial amounts of money in Kadish's escrow account, under his advice, to be used for any restitution claim. Scott requested that I discuss with Mr. Kadish the use of the retainer and the availability of the escrowed funds.

5.

After many attempts at communication, Mr. Kadish contacted me and spent most of his time telling me that he did not recognize my name. I informed Mr. Kadish that I am not a criminal defense attorney and that I was only inquiring on Scott's behalf as a

friend and general legal counsel. I requested that Mr. Kadish release the funds and return the retainer so that Scott could hire other counsel. He refused.

I had Ms. Ann Shafer get involved to help Scott. However, because Mr. Kadish would not release the funds, she could not represent Scott. Scott did not have the money to hire another attorney. Ms. Shafer did, among other things, make it possible for Scott to review his files with the US District Attorney.

I also remember from this time that a brief was necessary to be filed prior to Scott's sentencing. Scott and I discussed the brief. I could not assist Scott because I was not sufficiently familiar with criminal law. We both contacted Mr. Kadish to push him to prepare the brief. At first, he requested more money. Then he reluctantly prepared the documents.

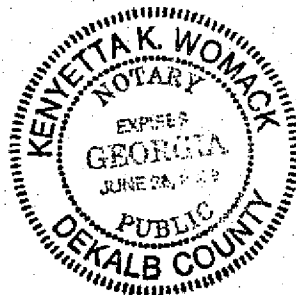
